




PART I

Irish Voracity (1066-1650)



is the Gaelic kingdom that, at least from the 5th century AD, extended on both sides of the North Channel and composed the northern part of the present County Antrim, Northern Ireland, and part of the Inner Hebrides and Argyll, in Scotland. In earlier times, Argyll had received extensive immigration from the fierce Irish of Northern Ireland (known as "Scoti"), and had become an Irish (i.e., "Scottish") area. In the latter half of the 5th century, the ruling family of Irish Dalriada crossed into Scottish Dalriada and made Dunadd and Dunolly its chief strongholds.

Eochaid Muinremar MacAengusa
(King of Irish Dál n'Araide)

c. 410-43

[My 47th Great-grandfather]



He was born in Antrim, Northern Ireland, child of King Áengus Fertt MacFeideilmid of Dál n'Araide. He married Loarn "Queen of Ireland" Erca in 430. He died in Antrim, Northern Ireland. Age 29.

Ercc Earc MacEochaid
(King of Irish DalRiata)

c. 400-474

[My 46th Great-grandfather]

He was born the child of Eochaid Muinremar MacAengusa Dál, King of Ireland, and Loarn "Queen of Ireland". He married Marca Erea Of Scotland Queen of Dalriada. He later married Misi Mist, Queen of Irish Dal Riada in 439. Died Age 74.



Fergus Mor MacErcc

King of Ireland and 1st King of Dalraita “Scotland”

c. 400-474

[My 45th Great-grandfather]



When he was born in Argyll, his father, Ercc, was 30 and his mother, Marca, was 18. He has one child with Duinseach Connacht Dalriada and two more children. He died in Argyll. Age 71.

Fergus was visited by Saint Patrick. In the 10th century edition of the Tripartite life of Saint Patrick: "Patrick received welcome in that territory from the twelve sons of Ercc; and Fergus More, son of Ercc, said to Patrick 'if thy reverence would, influence my brother in dividing the land I would give it to thee'. And Patrick granted this division to Bishop Olcan in Airthermuighe. Patrick said to Fergus "Though thy land is not great at this day among thy brothers it is thou who shalt be king. From thee shall descend the kings of this territory forever." This was fulfilled in Aedan the son of Gabran who took Alba by Force.

He was born in Argyll, the child of Fergus "King of Ireland and 1st King of Scotland" and Duinseach Connacht. He married Fedelmia Foltchain The Fair Queen of Dalriada of Connaught Ingen Briuin in 489. He died in Dunolly Castle, Dunadd, Dalriada, Argyllshire, Scotland. Age 42.

c. 490-558

[My 43rd Great-grandfather]

He was born in Argyll, the child of Domangart I Reti The Treacherous King of Dalraida and Fedelmia Foltchain The Fair Queen of Dalriada of Connaught. He married Ingenach Llelan Queen of Scotland and South Wales verch Brychan in 548. They had two children during their marriage. He died age 70.

“King of Picts”

Aedan (Aidan) of Dalriada MacGabhran.

(King of Dalriada “Scotland”, 574-608)


c. 532-608

[My 42nd Great-grandfather]

When Aedan (Aidan) "King of Picts" of Dalriada MacGabhran was born in Argyll, his father, GABRAN, was 42 and his mother, Ingenach, was 30. He married Ygern The True High Queen of The Celtic Kindoms de Boutgogne Del Acqs. They had four children during their marriage. Áedán was reputedly ordained King of Argyll by his cousin St. Columba, the first known Christian ordination in Britain. He died in Kilkerran, Argyll, age 76. Aedan's son Prince Artúr mac Aedan, was later portrayed as a source of King Arthur legends. Handsome, bold, and beloved by his comrades, he died young in 596 in the Battle Against the Maitai in Dal Riada.

(King of Dalriada "Scotland", 608-629)

c. 565-629

[My 41st Great-grandfather]

When he was born in 565 in Dunolly Castle, Dalriada, Argyllshire, Scotland, his father, Aedan, was 33 and his mother, Ygernna, was 32. He had two sons with Thurida, Queen of Dalriada and Scotland of Mumhan between 580 and 603. He died in battle with rival family members 629 in Argyll. Age 64.



"Donald the Freckled"

Domnal I Brecc

King of Dal Riata "Scotland"

c. 580 - 643

[My 40th Great-grandfather]

When King Domnal I "Donald the Freckled" Brecc was born about 580, his father, Eochaid, was 15. He had two sons with Bernicia or Gwid De Picts. He died in 643 in the Scottish Highlands during the Battle of Strathcarron with rival family clans.



Domangart Dongart II MacDomnaill
(King of Dal Riata “Scotland”, 688-695)

c. 625 - 695

[My 39th Great-grandfather]



When Domangart Dongart II MacDomnaill was born his father, King, was 45 and his mother, Bernicia, was 17. He had one son with Inconnu, Princess of the Picts, De Picts Leainftech in 658. He was murdered by a rival family branch in 695 in Argyll. Age 70.

"Crooked-Nose"

Findon Echach Eochaid II
King of Dal Riata “Scotland, 697

c. 658 - 697

[My 38th Great-grandfather]

He was born in 658 in Argyll, the child of Domangart Dongart II and Inconnu, Princess of the Picts, De Picts. He married Spondana Picts in Iona, Argyll. They had one child during their marriage. He died 697 in Fife. Age 39.



Eochaid III

Angbaid MacEchach of Argyll Dalriada.

c. 690 – 733

[My 37th Great-grandfather]



Eochaid III Angbaid MacEchach of Argyll Dalriada was born in 690 in Argyll, the child of Findon Echach Eochaid II "Crook Nose" and Spondana. He married Lochaber. They had one child during their marriage. He died in 733 in Argyll. Age 43.

"The White"

Aed Mac Ehdach

(King of Dal Riata “Scotland” 739-778)

c. 714 - 778

[My 36th Great-grandfather]

He was born in 714 in Argyll, the child of Eochaid III Angbaid MacEchach of Argyll Dalriada and mother Lochaber. He married Fergina Aed, Queen of Dal Riata, Princess of The Picts MacWrold in Argyll. He died in 778 in Fordoun, Kincardineshire,. Age 64.



“The Venomous”

Eochaid IV MacAodh

(King of Scots, 781))

c. 747 - 819

[My 35th Great-grandfather]



He was born on September 3, 747, in Argyll, the child of Aed "Aodh The White" and Fergina Aed, Queen of Dal Riata, Princess of The Picts. He married Fergus Urgusia Princess Royal of Picts Queen of Scotland in 775 in Argyll. He died September 4, 819, in Argyll. Age 72.
